Tanja Playner

Austria

Born in USSR and living in Austria, artist Tanja Playner shares optimism and zest for life with her strikingly colorful unique works of art. With her works of art, the artist communicates with people in order to make modern society a little better. She has managed to thrill millions of people with her art. On Twitter follow the artist about 500,000 followers, on facebook about 1,000,000 fans, as also many thousands followers on instagram worldwide. In social media, the artist reaches more than 15 million people a month with her art.

Critics compared her to a mix of Andy Warhol, Roy Lichtenstein and Strokes by Picasso. The British Vogue publishes the artwork "Mona Lisa" by Tanja Playner under Vogue's Masterpiece ... and GQ Magazine publishes the work "Sweet Whisper" in November 2015 alongside Daniel Craig & Monica Belucci and Photograph Ranking with her ranking among the top 300 artists worldwide on artnet. In April 2016 Tanja Playner was listed in the Top 5 Twitter Kings in the Media Magazine in 2nd place. In January 2019 she was listed under the Top internet stars of Austria in one of the biggest newspaper in Austria "Österreich".

Tanja Playner also deals with modern objects, consumer products and people's emotions. She speaks in her art about the way of our society and touches the hearts of the beholder with colorful colors in conjunction with positive emotions. Her motives are not sad emotions, and they are the opposite of cartoons.

Since 2018 Tanja Playner has been experimenting with body plasticity, space and the human sense of self in relation to objects and space. In combination with her already developed style, the artworks often show controversial depictions of the human body to reality.

In contrast to the artist Georg Baselitz, who mainly turns the human body upside down, Tanja Playner places the human body perpendicular to objects. Split upper bodies and lower bodies can often be seen on the artworks, placed perpendicularly, parallel or transversely to one another.

The often split upper and lower bodies are not only placed perpendicularly, parallel or transversely to each other, but also to the landscapes, still lifes and objects. Often the images are presented in combination with abstract, intricate wavy lines that minimize abstract depiction.

With the conspicuousness of her pop art motifs, she reached number 11 in the July 2017 ranking of the top 300 artists worldwide on artnet and stood in front of Damien Hirst, Fernando Botero, Gerhard Richter, Jeff Koons, Yayoi Kusama, Alex Katz, Mr. Brainwash, Takashi Murakami. The artworks of Tanja Playner have been featured in over 50 international exhibitions such as the Antoni Gaudi Modernist Museum in Barcelona, as far as Carrousel du Louvre Paris during the FIAC Art Week 2014 - 2019, Art Basel Miami Art Week 2015, Art Basel Art Week 2019 at the Art Biennale Basel, shown during Cannes Film Festival 2015 - 2019 and Quest Hall Harajuku in Tokyo. The grandson of Ferdinand Porsche Ernst Piech has shown 50 large-format works of Tanja Playner in his museum "FahrTraum" and and also he has art of Tanja Playner in his collection. Also the actress Ornella Muti has the artwork of Tanja Playner in her own.

Tanja Playner is one of the few artists worldwide who was dedicated her own art museum at the age of 32.

MANO has been painting for more than three decades. One day, on a beautiful snowy afternoon in Stockholm, when her first son was sleeping in his bedroom and she was pregnant with her daughter, she looked out the window. The wonderful white scene in the garden, the blue sea next to them and the serene atmosphere outside greatly inspired her to capture this wonder and paint it with oil on canvas.

She has been influenced by some very famous and talented Hungarian and renowned international artists. From the very beginning, MANO admired the Hungarian history painter Gyula Benczur (1844 – 1920), the Catalan artistic genius Salvador Dali, the Italian Caravaggio and the Dutchman Jan Vermeer van Delft.

As a young journalist - Editor-in-Chief of Inflight Magazine - she worked for Hungarian Airlines in the 90s, which gave her the opportunity to travel quite a bit. This interest in travel never died out... Her travels were encounters and discoveries of unique people, recognizing and admiring incredible nature and landscapes. As a result, she quickly realized how important our earth, the nature surrounding it with its great flora and fauna, is for us.

Although she genuinely loves living and enjoying my own homeland, after her husband's business stints abroad, she joined him and spent almost 15 years outside of Hungary. MANO has lived in Sweden, Israel and Belgium, gaining unique inspiration and learning interesting lessons from those experiences.

After spending 10 years in Stockholm, she is fortunate to meet and study with her famous artist-compatriot Endre Nemes, professor at the University of Gothenburg, whose vision and directions greatly inspired her. MANO started painting in oil on canvas about 30 years ago, trying to follow her teacher's wise advice to focus on details of great landscapes, clean and sparkling rivers, huge lakes and of course the Baltic Sea. She also enjoys painting interesting people, their eyes and faces, which she has also captured on her canvas. MANO has had solo and group exhibitions in Hungary, Sweden, Israel, Austria, Belgium, Romania, USA, Canada and Italy.

"I am happy when depicting beautiful meadows with flowers, conveying the mood of forest roads in summer afternoon or winter time, when showing hills and mountains, running waters in different shapes. In my view they are the real expressions of our beloved world which needs to be safeguarded and well-preserved for the future generations!"

Luca Ripamonti

Italy

About the artist- a path marked since childhood.

" As a child I thought I would become a cartoonist. Today I am a painter because painting makes me happy".

Thus the Lombard artist outlines in a few words what has been an almost 'obligatory' path of his career as an artist.

When he was only five years old, the family moved to live in a place still today called the 'Valley of the Painters'. He is only 8 years old when a local painter recognizes his innate talent, calling him 'prodigious' and which almost forces Luca's parents, unaccustomed to art, to enroll their son in the local art school. The Rossetti Valentini School (today a Museum!) Which in history has seen artists of the caliber of Carlo Fornara, the undisputed master of divisionism, or Enrico Cavalli, a pupil of Eugene Delacroix, pass among his masters. Luca must certainly have absorbed an artistic influence of great level since his first years of life; without forgetting that a brother of Luca's grandfather, uncle Celestino, also a painter, had been a friend and pupil of Giorgio De Chirico!!

Yes! we can say with certainty that, if it is true as it is true that a profound artistic aptitude was innate in Luca, all these multiple factors have undoubtedly shaped and positively conditioned his evolution.

Yet, he will never attend the art school and then continue his studies at the Brera Academy, as he dreams and confides to his mother. In fact, his own parents will preclude him from pursuing his own aspirations, forcing him to study in a 'grey' industrial technical institute.

But once again, that 'valley of the ctors' 'haunts' him; it will in fact be right there, that around the age of sixteen he will meet Giuseppe Calzolari, founder and at the time director of the 'School of Comics' in Milan. He too, after meeting Luca, will appreciate his talent and encourage him to attend the prestigious school in Milan. Luca thus begins to follow the so-called 'Long-Distance' lessons of the school, and will have the opportunity to study fundamental methods for his artistic growth, methods that come directly from the U.S.A. (it must be remembered that at that time the Internet did not exist!).

Giuseppe Calzolari provides him with texts such as: 'Human anatomy for artists', by Burne Hogarth and the 'Course de dessin by Bargue, on which art geniuses such as Van Gogh were trained; From there; picasso.

However, after about a year something happens. Luca decides to abandon everything to become a pupil and student at the studio of the painter, well known nationwide, Ugo Bernetti Da Vila.

The master, a profound connoisseur of realist techniques and a forerunner of Hyperrealism, at that time improperly called photographic technique, will start Luca on a long journey of guidance and learning of pictorial techniques, for almost a decade. Until the year preceding his disappearance in 1995.

The artist remembers his precious teachings but also his criticisms:".. Yes! you spread the colors like a great master, you hint at the nuances as if you had done nothing else in your life, but you don't know anything about what you do!! you don't know why one color goes next to another, you do it instinctively, but that's not enough!! Do you think Raphael combined colors at random?? you have to study color theory, you have to do as I tell you...".

With the death of the master, Luca embarks on 'alternative' artistic paths; among these he becomes a bodybuilding instructor and will also open a gym. From that period Luca recalls that building a body was for him: ".. how to sculpt a living material, form the shoulders, the arms, slim the waist, build a sculpture.." this extreme vision of a sport can make us understand how Art was always present in his life horizons.


After a decade dedicated to sport, he embarks on a career as a musician. He begins to study jazz drums, first with private lessons and then following courses at the Berkley School of Music in Boston, and in a few years becomes, in turn, an instrument teacher and a musician. Once again, Luca's artistic vitality tries to express itself overbearingly.

But it is only in the year of Covid, 2020, that the great decision to publish his first painting finally matures. It is a winter landscape, a panorama well known to him given the years spent in the Alps. He participates, without much expectation, in the second edition of the 'Antonio Ligabue' prize in Orvieto and is named the winner out of a shortlist of over 300 artists, both emerging and non-emerging.

From there the transition to professionalism is short! Of course, if one thinks of his meteoric career, one is stunned, but if one knows the story of this artist at all, one cannot but understand that his destiny as a painter was a path marked out from childhood.

Janusz Tworek

Poland

Janusz Tworek, lives in Krakow, Poland and Tenerife. Janusz has been an architect for almost 40 years. Like everyone who works in this profession, he is suspended between artistic sensitivity and engineering precision of thinking. In addition to drawing and painting, he made attempts in the field of ceramics and stained glass. He also works with photography for most of his life. The unique atmosphere of Tenerife, the openness of the local population promotes self-development and work on oneself. IHe is self-taught painting. The awareness that one of the most outstanding contemporary painters, Francis Bacon, was also a self-taught person, gives me strength to work and artistic development. He looks all the time, that's why he tries his hand at realistic and abstract painting. In addition to painting, he still draws with pencil, charcoal and pastels. Sometimes he also uses other techniques. It all makes him do things completely different, both in terms of mood and expression. Much depends on the atmosphere of the moment he's in. Living in Tenerife, Janus Tworek mets an exceptional person with a typically Canarian kindness and cheerful spirit, an outstanding artist Javier Huerta. He is both a professional and self-taught artist. Dozens of works that Janusz has made are inspired by the contact with this unique artistic personality. In Poland, Janusz cooperates with several art galleries: Pikoteka, Kontrowersyjna, Avantgarden, MB-Artconsult. He also collaborates with the M.A.D.S Art Gallery in Milan, Paks Gallery Vienna and ArtioGallery Toronto, Rossocinabro Roma Italia.

For Janusz Tworek, art is the basic way of expressing his attitude to reality. The paintings and drawings he creates flow from the instinctive zone, operating beyond intellectual considerations. He believes that this makes them the most authentic representation of reality. Janusz Tworek also writes poems resulting from intellectual contestation. He combined both these means of expression on several occasions. It seems to him that this creates the fullest message.

His painting is spontaneous, resulting from the emotions he experiences. That is why his works are so different from each other. Most often, the ideas that are the intellectual basis of what he wants to paint change under the influence of the emotions of the moments. Hence his motto "emotions are everything - everything is emotion".

Despite the age of 65, she studies all the time. He doesn't wonder if he has a "style" of painting. He tries to paint as best he can. And this is changing thanks to new experiences. Certainly his "style" is not realism.

Each work is an expression of his lived experiences, which creates an emotional bond with each of them. When he finishes the painting, he feels a kind of relief and thinks about what will happen next.

He believes that it is important to return to the roots of the role of art in human life. That is why it is so important to make the artists themselves aware of the important social role they play. They create things that have always been the markers of the level of maturity of the community. The need for communing with art has been an inherent need of mankind since the dawn of time. Unfortunately, today it is not so obvious.



Ketil Eriksen is a visual artist based in Denmark. Beginning to approach art at a young age, he only later became a professional artist, participating in several group exhibitions in Austria, Italy, Germany, Sweden, UAE, Switzerland, China, Spain and the USA. His artistic research focuses on shapes and colors, as well as gestural and instinctive force, applying compositional research. The resulting abstractionism hints at an ambiguity: on the one hand, the immediacy of gesture emerges; on the other hand, the harmonious compositions hint at premeditation and thus one might assume a "reasoned randomness". The titles of Ketil Eriksen's works on canvas make these statements explicit: they are titled "Composition", emphasizing the importance the artist himself attaches to visual harmony and weights. In fact, the canvases in most cases present a white and neutral background against which the acrylic strokes stand out and become protagonists. Black is the dominant and recurring color in all the works. The artist makes immediate, quick and forceful gestures, drawing on the Abstract Expressionist painting of the master Jackson Pollock. Black is always placed in dialogue with one or two colors, often primary, with which the artist plays to create a layering that creates a certain depth. The choice of color conveys a message, a symbology, which becomes subjective and free to be interpreted by each individual viewer. The strength of black on the white canvas inevitably refers to Zen Buddhist art and in particular its ideology: one stroke the ink brushstroke that draws the circle is traced on silk or rice paper in a single gesture, without any possibility of change or correction, thus showing the expressive movement of the spirit, at that precise moment. Likewise, Ketil Eriksen's art encapsulates a precise emotion, a precise energy that is returned to the audience to be shaped and reshaped in a personal way by everyone.

"I was selected by Artist Hana to take part in an exhibit using her new paints. I loved working with the paints because they behave like an oil paint in that you mix the pigment and base. It can also behave like a watercolor or acrylic depending on your mix and technique. The paintings were exhibited with Hana, the AIA (American Institute of Architects) and InVision Glass in the USA. I enjoyed working with the paints because they had such a high quality, and are environmentally ethical".

In 2020, English Painter and Chemist, Artist Hana invented the brand-new medium placrylic for artists, that addresses the climate and health concerns modern artists are worried about.

Placrylic™ is a plant paint that behaves similar to the acrylic paint used by artists and designers, unlike acrylic paints which are made of plastic (a microthermoplastic), placrylic is plastic free, and when mixed with plant based pigments, produces a unique new artist paint medium and the great thing about placrylic is that you can mix it with other paints including acrylic.

Placrylic™ also behaves like traditional oil paint in that artists can work in layers. However, unlike oil paint, which typical requires titanium white paint and has a negative impact on ocean chemistry when washed down the drain, placrylic is 100% titanium free, marine friendly, and safe for use by artists.

November 2022, Placrylic is now used by 50+ artists from twelve countries including the United Kingdom, USA, Canada, Germany, Italy, Israel, Nigeria, South Korea, Sweden, Netherlands and Belgium.

Placrylic is a fast-drying paint made entirely of plants.

Graduate of laws from the Faculty of Law Universidad Panamericana / Graduate of Philosofy by the Universidad Panamericana / Master in Law from the Same University / Diplomat in techniques and materials at the Fine Arts Academy of San Carlos (UNAM) / Diploma in Drawing in the same Institution / Cinematography at the Mexican Association of Independent Filmmakers / Diplomat in Narrative by the University Center for Cinematographic Studies (CUEC) / Diploma in scriptwriting by

the same Institutio / Diploma in luxury marketing from the European Institute of Luxury-Anáhuac University.

Federico Kampf has worked as an artist for the last fifteen years of his life. He has had a successful career. Since its first exhibition in 2010 in Paris, he has received excellent comments from critics in that city. From there, various important exhibitions followed, especially in Europe. In 2014 he was commissioned to carry out the important Mural at the San Alejandro Academy of Fine Arts in Havana Cuba.

His technique is different and revolutionary by rescuing ancestral techniques such as fresco and encaustic used by artists 2,000 years ago and by Miguel Angel Buonarroti and Mexican muralism.

He has worked on disruptive architecture projects for hotels and real estate developments in Mexico and the United States.

He studied cinema and between 2011 and 2014 he participated in many films as Director and Art Director to the extent of winning various awards and being an official selection at Film Festivals.

In 2014 he made the most important mural in Mexico, "El Coloso", a mural that is located on the most important avenue in Mexico City, made using classical techniques and measuring 110 m2.

In 2015 he was called from Rome, Italy, by the Polmone Pulsante Museum for the realization of the Fresco Mural "Energy, Time and Consciousness", as the first Mexican in history to create a mural in Italy. The museum site, co-owned by the

Government of Rome, is a building with 2,000 years of history, in the historic center of Rome, in the archaeological area. It is a mural that high-ranking dignitaries of world politics visit.

Last year the important First Federico Kampf Biennial was established, in honor of the artist, in which 200 Mexican artists signed up and whose purpose is to promote art in general and create links and economic and self-improvement situations.

Being a leader in the area of art and culture, Federico has various honorary positions.

His work has had an impressive growth in terms of investment for his collectors, among whom are presidents of State, celebrities and international athletes.



As a result, she became involved in taking part at various personal exhibitions and also at the Thessaloniki International Jewellery Fair. After winning the 1st prize in the competition to design jewellery for the Olympics, she was invited to appear on the TV program, << Art & Civilisation >> on channel ERT1.

Later compiling a book of all the designs of products for the Olympic games.

Her lifelong passion with fashion magazines led her into this field. Allowing her to gain experience in various magazines such as COSMOPOLITAN, HIGH LIFE, CHILD & NEW PARENTS, SUPER TV, DIVA, KLIK and HEAVY METAL.

In concurrence with the above, she carried out freelance work for the following clients, G.G.ADV, DOT & DASH, ADEL SAACHI & SAACHI, BOLD, EURO LEO BURNETT, ROTHMANS Ltd, SWATCH, ALL SPORT CLUB, SMIRNOFF VODKA and NESTLE.

Using her artistic skills and experience in the fashion industry, she worked as a make-up artist at ARTISTS, also Creative art director at PRESTIGE and ACE model agencies. She was personally recommended by Mr Vidal Sassoon for her attitude, colour sense and work ethic.

Her love for music coupled with her skills in graphic design allowed her to successfully carry out freelance design & art direction for records and CD covers for WEA-GREECE (Warner Music), SONY MUSIC S.A., BMG ARIOLA S.A. also cooperation with EMI and ARTISTIC. During her time with Warner Music she was responsible for the creative art direction and design for Lion King Greece.

In 1998 she moved to the UK, where she has worked freelance on designing a large number of cartoon characters and storylines, particularly under sea creatures. This innovative work was then applied to several product lines. i.e. Cards, Books, Flyers and Clothes. She developed a conceptual design for small illustrated books where the subject was 'Love and Emotion'.

She created a book 'Stay Soft' which takes the viewer on a personal voyage that encompasses her experience in the field and demonstrates the fusion of illustration, photography and graphic design.

This, takes the form of an entirely graphical miniature coffee table book, $(15 \times 15 \text{cm})$ that would appeal to the artistic instincts of the people that look at it. 'Stay Soft' could form the basis for a series of books on this topic. Each artwork is a product in its own right and can be marketed as Printed artwork, Cards, Posters, Fabrics, Bags, Tee shirts and various industrial applications. The target group would be Artists, Graphic designers, Photographers, Dreamers and Lovers.

She has taken part in a number of exhibitions in Manchester and London UK, Milan and Florence Italy, Fuerteventura Canary Islands and Biennale Barcelona. Her artworks have been shown in various catalogues and publications on the international stage. She has received many international awards and her work has been presented in the portfolio of Artsv.

My work is described as Hybrid Digital PrintTM, a compilation of illustration, photography and graphic design, which transcends the viewer into a personal voyage, entailing and sharing my own unique experience.

My love and admiration for faces from different eras, stems from my days studying history of art in portraiture. This has enabled me to create a fusion between classic pieces of art and modern day photographic portraits and elevate them into a unique and more personal level.



Her exposure to different landscapes and traditions has inspired her to convey diversity through her work. Sydni considers herself a traditional artist using Acrylic and oils paints as her primary mediums. She combines her passion for earthly photography, black and Native American culture, and nature's beauty to tell her artistic story.

Sydni is influenced by the historical greats and from people she has met along the way in recent times. And the top three of those people are the Modupe Odusote, Debra Tonge, and Blair Treuer.

For Sydni, the death of George Floyd is the moment that changed the world altogether. "The tragedy was a stark reminder, specifically for Black Americans, of the deep systemic realities underlying Black life. And the Black Lives Matter movement open many doors for black artist, including My very first show the black girl art show in Los Angeles".

Being a mother is a big part of Sydni Peeler and so you'll see that represented through many of her works but one in particular that sticks out would be the piece she has titled "I see color", which is both inspired by her own childhood and situations she has seen her daughter go through as a mixed race child at a school that doesn't necessarily represent the most diversity.

In her initial heritage series she was influenced by a tribes of a mixture of tribes from both eastern and western Africa, as well as the native American tribe Choctaw. After Sydni doing some research on those drives and seeing how similar they were even though so they were on different continents. It encouraged her to look at other cultures and other tribes and other similarities from even other continents.

Keith Edwards

Digital art by Keith Edwards is art at the intersection of the subconscious and the conscious. Where seemingly unremarkable photos or everyday drawing subjects become an illuminating map of the artist's inner world that echoes the emotional energy of his personal stories and experience. Edwards emphasizes living the existential experience in his works of art. He believes creating his art is an act of "free will", yet he believes that free will exists only as choices delivered to his conscious mind from the subconscious. It follows that his description of his artistic experience is in terms of combining artistic vision from his conscious and subconscious mind. "I make artistic choices based on feelings of harmony and dissonance generated from what I see and what I imagine on the canvas. Harmony and dissonance each require only two signals to exist just like two musical tones. For me one "tone" is conscious and instinctive and the other is subconscious. As I observe, change, or imagine aspects of the artwork, these tones change in response and deliver associated feelings of harmony and dissonance. I usually prefer harmony, but I often choose dissonance to enrich the artwork with more effect and contrast". This is where all works of art become his living memoirs. Each digital stroke of the brush results from this internal source that the artist considers the birthplace of his art.

Edwards' lifelong commitment to music can also be seen in the movement and dynamism of his paintings. It is an endless exploration of the parallels between the conscious and the unconscious as if pixels were his emotions' memory cells and repositories. There is excellent coverage of the area, its depth, and perspective, which the artist believes might be attributable to visual perception honed from years working as a flight instructor and photography pilot. Multiple layers of pixels and vectors, altered, superimposed, stretched, compressed, and filled with colors and other elements make Edwards' work rich, vivid, and oil-painting like x-rays of his being.

Artistry training began at an early age in Keith's mother Ingrid's art studio. Here he was introduced to working with everything from charcoal and pastels to oil painting to watercolors. He was taken to innumerable art galleries and exhibitions. Growing up he stretched and prepared canvases and cleaned brushes, transported, and hung paintings in exhibitions, attended the exhibition then broke it down again. Keith was constantly surrounded by his mother's artist friends and their work, as well as her students from the high school where she ran the art department. In school Keith studied pottery, oil painting and lapidary. About his new art career, he says "It was as if I hatched from the shell already formed stylistically as an artist. This has become increasingly apparent as I expand my art and branch out visually".

Keith Edwards dives into the digital world. His artworks are the result between realism and the digital world. In his art, Keith Edwards deals with history, architecture, everyday life and surrealistic visions.

Some artworks approach surrealism. The horses from The American Old West's "Comancheros" series are reminiscent of the horses of Salvador Dali. In this series, Keith Edwards has transformed the history of the American Wild West into works of art. In the architecture-related artworks, the artist turns to colors that create a strong light. Some of these works are reminiscent of impressionism in digital form.

His revised digital animal images from everyday life bring a personal touch. Wavy lines and dabbed color changes look almost as if they were painted.

A wide range of applications in the artworks demonstrates the experimental nature of the artworks. Keith Edwards also places his works of art in a mobile form. Rotating the image material creates the image landscape and image of the music wave frequency, which shows the mirrored image material after turning it over. You have the impression of walking through the heart of the artwork, which makes for a very interesting experience.

The overall concept of art by Keith Edwards shows his need to explore the various art media and to challenge himself as an artist to find new ways in art.

Keith Edwards was born in New York City into a family of creatives: his dad wrote the musical 1776, his mom was a New York artist and Broadway dancer, and his sister played for the Boston Symphony. Keith trained from an early age on piano and French horn and naturally wrote original music; however, at some point, he devoted most of his time to sports and aviation training. He became a professional pilot at age twenty-one, working as a flight instructor and genal aviation pilot. He believes the visual training and experience of dealing with optical illusions and odd perspectives, especially in and around landings, and flying in varying visibility conditions as elements that helped him develop his artistic vision in the future.

Over time, the seeds of Keith's musical creativity became represented in visual imagery.

While traveling widely and living in locales worldwide, he came to believe that similarities amongst disparate peoples and cultures around the world originate in the unconscious. Keith jokingly attributes his natural tenacity to genetics and athletics but credits it with helping him to put in the time to break new ground artistically.

When the pandemic and the lockdown arrived, Keith understood he needed a new activity, so he began organizing his travel photos and playing with the images. His pilot vision, commitment and feeling of music, and travel insights met at one point, where his contemporary digital art was born. Some of these works were submitted to art contests online and international curators. The University of Arizona Museum of Art in Tucson was the first to accept one of his pictures for an exhibit. At about the same time he won the Raw Art Review Journal Summer 2020 Cover Art award and was published in their magazine along with two other works. This was encouraging and subsequently Keith began submitting more and has been published in numerous commercial journals. In the four months since July 2022 his work has been accepted into a steady stream of prestigious international exhibitions with showings 2 in Venice, Parma, and Rome Italy, two exhibitions in New

in Venice, Parma, and Rome Italy, two exhibitions in New York City, and an exhibition in Istanbul Turkey.

Now, Keith Edwards resides in Vlore, Albania and works daily in his home studio/gallery. His work is regularly being shown in numerous exhibits and magazines, and he continues working on his artistic and stylistic expansion.

Miho Inagaki, a Japanese ceramic artist, was born in Kita-Kyushu, Japan in 1950. After working as an editor of craft books, she started creating a ceramic art in her own way. At the beginning, her works were just ordinary ones, however, after she got her own kiln in 1989, they turned out to be quite unique throughout her trial-and-error approach. She uses an old custom-made electric kiln that has a chamber for the wood-fired reduction. It takes about 14 hours to bake ceramic arts in her kiln.

My works can be divided into three types.

Type 1: Clay and Stainless-Steel mesh which shrinks differently each other, turns unexpected appearance and distortion in shape when fired. Using Stainless-Steel mesh has a big risk, but it would be the best way to express my theme, everything is a repetition of change and reborn.

Type 2: Imaginary creature. With a playful and pure mind like a child, strange creatures happen to appear.

Type 3: Daily goods: dish, pot, vase, lampshade etc.... In Japan, different types of clay can be found in various places, that is why each area has a unique pottery. I have been pursuing my individuality among a wide variety thing.



Pilar Rivero's works are characterized by simple, reduced painting. In addition to the abstract and reduced works, she also paints portraits.

Pilar Rivero's expressive, minimalist painting is somewhat reminiscent of Jean-Michel Basquiat. Some works go back to the origin of painting and have elements of cave painting. Minimalist conception of some works bears elements from the naïve art of Dadaism. Pilar Rivero separates objects in the work of art like building blocks and puts them together in painterly form like a collage. With this simplified style, Pilar Rivero brings an enigmatic character to the works. The social character of the artworks is important to the artist. In many of her works, she combines symbolic places for people with representations of people in a reduced form. These are often the lines or balls that she uses in her works as a form of connection between society.

For her, balance is the diversity that the artist brings to her works through many colours, objects and people. In the work "The Orange Man" she ambiguously points to the human personality in her own way: it is the man who has a lot in him and everyone is an individual, from the other side one sees the human being as an outsider somehow from society, is not accepted, which also distances itself. However, some males have a friendly facial expression and are drawn like a staircase. This staircase can be called a connecting element.

Pilar Rivero's works can be described as quite simple, but that is what makes them very interesting and tempting to engage with the work more and try to look behind the artist's thoughts.

Sotaro Takanami

Japan

"I always draw at a fixed time. It's about 6 to 8 in the morning. At that time, I want to draw pictures so that I feel hungry and want to eat.

Painting is like water I drink when I'm thirsty in the desert, and living with something essential to living for me who has a bad mental balance".

Many of Sotaro Takanami's works are shaped by nature. The origin of his technique approaches that of Van Gogh, who applied the colors directly to the canvas, painting with thick pasty strokes. Sotaro Takanami goes above and beyond. The artist presses the colors onto the canvas in several layers. The resulting layers give the artworks structure and create a deep effect. For Sotaro Takanami, painting is necessary to survive, like water in the desert. This strong need to paint can be felt in his artworks. In his works of art from the Bamboo series, the artist brings movement into play, which can be seen and felt through the implementation of color. Only one color can be seen. But this color is not flat, it is not painted in motion across the canvas, it is not applied diluted. The artist gives life to color. It's succulent through the paint, it's thickly applied, it enlivens the work of art. One sees nature in the picture, one sees the artist's need to show us his perception of nature.

Also in his works like "Field Flowers" the voluminous feeling of the depiction of the picture is important to the artist. And indeed it works when we look at the field with flowers from the Alm. Pasty dots that make a big impact.

His works of art with still lifes are painted in a very minimalistic and pasty manner. An approach to Matisse and Cezanne can be felt, but Sotaro Takanami experiments in these works and also brings Japanese character here. In the artwork Field Flowers (2017) one can also sense the influence of artists such as Claude Monet, but also the influence of abstract expressionists such as Jackson Pollock, Joan Mitchell or Cy Twombly. In his artworks, Sotaro Takanami combines Impressionist traits with Abstract Expressionism, thereby creating his vision of art. He also revisits his vision of Japanese culture, such as depicting the dragon in the artwork Dragon (2010).

In the earlier works such as Bamboo Forest one observes more classical representations of nature. However, movement is also important to the artist in these pictures. Sotaro Takanami doesn't just paint chaotic strokes in the background of the palm trees. It is important for the artist to show the mood of the strong wind. Here you notice Japanese painting, which fascinates you with the fine elaboration and special picture motif. Each leaf has a special movement reminiscent of Japanese painting due to the application of the brushstroke, each tree trunk moves with the wind.

My art is worth examining, whether it is mysterious and haunting or timeless and tasteful. Digging into the history of calligraphy in ancient Asian cultures yields fascinating origins. My work explores, honors, and brings out the nuance of traditional Kanji calligraphies by combining abstract art forms to maximize expressions of profound meanings. Calligraphy is one of the Japanese ways of expression. A significant feature of calligraphy is that it is based on characters. Such art is rare in the world.

Calligraphy is the main form of art that is writing Kanji characters with black Japanese ink, but until about 60 years ago, it was more of a culture than an art form. It was required to use ink and convey the content in beautiful Kanji characters, but Yuichi Inoue (1916-1985) and others began to express calligraphy as contemporary art. He started to perceive characters not as shapes, but as aesthetics. Kanji characters were born about 3,500 years ago and were born based on the lifestyle at the time. As can be seen from this, there are parts that are not enough to express modern emotions and information. And I believe it's worth pushing forward with the abstract expression of calligraphy that is freed from the form of Kanji characters in the present age. A calligraphic expression like this is expressionism that focuses on the object itself without drawing the background, which is often seen in oriental paintings. And I think that there is a great affinity with manga culture, where characters are assimilated. In the 21st century, I believe that expressions that are liberated from the shape of Kanji characters, while characters as the axis, will have artistic value.

WAZEN is a Calligrapher and Contemporary painting artist.

Born in 1985 in Japan.

Graduated from the Department of Calligraphy, NIIGATA UNIVERSITY, Japan. I started calligraphy when I was 8 years old.






